PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Vern Stuessy, Plant Manager for GCC Rio Grand Cement, gave an excellent program on GCC's plans for the Colorado Energy Recycles landfill at Midway at our January dinner meeting. GCC now owns the facility, and proposes to shred and burn approximately 2 million tires annually in place of coal in the cement kiln. Colorado currently is estimated to generate up to 4 million tires annually. The Pueblo Chieftain reported on January 20 that the El Paso County Commissioners recently voted to approve a memorandum of understanding to permit the landfill conversion and to provide discarded tires from the county's shops to go to the proposed shredding operation. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment still needs to approve the appropriate permits to allow for the burning of tires for fuel. The cement industry has shown at other facilities that the shredded tires burn hotter, cleaner, with fewer emissions than coal, and would be a good resource for reuse. Mr. Stuessy also extended an open invitation to tour the cement facility by contacting him.

Rob Leverington, P.E., P.L.S., has filed as a candidate for the office of Pueblo County Surveyor, and will be running as a Republican. In the weeks ahead, Rob will be forming a campaign committee and developing a strategy for the November election. Some of us may want to support this activity. Rob is an active member of COPE.

Eligibility Requirements and Application Form

for the LaRocca Memorial and the E. F. Gobatti Scholarship

The applicant must have completed his/her high school education in the City and/or County of Pueblo, Colorado, and must be a full-time student at an accredited college or university in the State of Colorado majoring in one of the following:

- Engineering--must be at least a second-semester Sophomore upon application.
- Engineering Technology--must be at least a second-semester Sophomore upon application.

A minimum cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 on a 4.0 system is required. The scholarship will be applicable for the academic year following the academic year in which the application is made and must be used to defray the costs of tuition and fees.

The applicant must be a citizen of the United States of America. The applicant must submit a new application for each school year for which a scholarship is desired. Reapplication must be accompanied by a statement confirming that 40 hours of volunteer service has been completed since the previous application.

Instructions

- I. Fill out the application form.
- II. Staple the following related documents to the application:
 - 1. The most recent unofficial grade transcript.
 - 2. Written recommendations from at least two professors in your major field of Engineering or Engineering Technology or from appropriate math/science professors.
 - 3. Confirmation of volunteer service for re-applications.
- III. Submit the completed application to the Coalition of Pueblo Engineers, P.O. Box 1841, Pueblo, CO 81002 no later than April 15th of each year to be eligible for scholarship consideration during the following academic year.
